Title: Library Orientation

Goal: To introduce library to the students and teachers with all the services and facilities of the library. To make them familiar with the ways to use library and learning facilities.

The context:

Reading books has become less frequent with the advancement in technology. It is a need of an hour to bring back the readers to the libraries to enhance and widen their knowledge.
